Ground Breaking for Veteran's Home

On Friday, March 19th at the Southern Arizona VA Health Care Center in Tucson Arizona, a groundbreaking ceremony was held for the new Arizona State Veteran's Home in Tucson. Governor Janice K. Brewer was the keynote speaker. Joey Strickland, (Col, USA, Ret), Director of Arizona Department of Veteran's Services (PUFL member in The American Legion), Tucson Mayor Bob Walkup, and SAVAHCS Director Jonathan Gardner also spoke. The new Veteran's Home is a \$27 million project joint venture between the Federal Government and the Arizona State Legislature. The 137,500 sq. ft. facility is scheduled to open in the fall of 2011. It will employ more than

150 local people and create an annual payroll of \$10 million for the Tucson/Pima County area. Jonathan Thomas, representative of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, blessed the ground with a traditional Tohono O'Odham song and blessing.

There was a large audience on hand for the festivities, including representatives of the VFW, DAV, Vietnam Veterans, Legion Riders, The American Legion, and many other veterans groups. The American Legion Department of Arizona, was well represented with Area A Vice Commander Ken Dowse, Area B Vice Commander George Cushing, PDC Louis Pellon, District 2 Commander Gary Nelson, Post 2 Commander Homer Pacheco, Post 55 Commander Joe Schneider, District 12 Service Officer Byron Weston, District 12/Post 84 Historian Gerry Gall, Post 36/District 2 Historian Tony Rigney, and Legion member and State Senator Frank Antenori (MSGT, USA Special Forces, Ret) among many others. Also on hand was Hervey Spencer of Green Valley, who is one of a dwindling number of Pearl Harbor Survivors.

This was a great day for Arizona's veterans and a major step along the road to providing our veterans and their spouses with the continuing care that they need so badly. This was also a great day for the Tucson/Pima County area, the State

of Arizona ... and all of the state's veteran's organizations. This is what we, in The American Legion, work for on a regular basis.

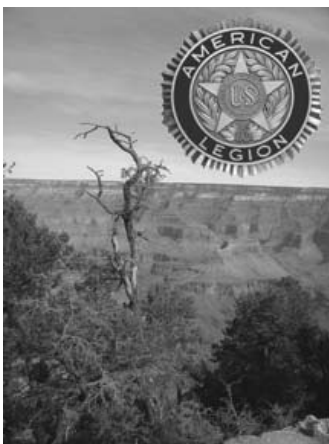

Honor Our Gold Star Families

As we are now in the "me first" and "entitlement" generation, more and more is being said about the veterans community. I say "community" because anyone who has or has had a family member in the military, in wartime or not, automatically becomes part of this exclusive family. Those that offer opinions from the outside of this elite group remind me of the "Monday morning quarterbacks".

Not to take away from the non-military individuals and families that unconditionally support the military families, we still have this cut and run group that do not or will not see that they are hurting our country and jeopardizing our national security by playing into the hands of our enemies. Driving a "green" car does not make you a patriot.

Many beliefs from this sector are merely opinion. I speak from experience, and I hope I speak for others who have had the honor of being accepted to wear the uniform of our country. Pulling out of Iraq pre-victory would be a mistake. It would be a mistake not only for the Iraqi people that want us there to finish the job, the majority that the media will not report on, but for the hundreds of thousands of Veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan.

Flashback to Vietnam; a war that I am familiar with. When we left there, pre-victory, the country went into chaos. Many more people died there after we left than when we were there. I am sure someone would say "oh, but not this time"; history has proved this to be true every time. True, American troops would no longer be at risk in Iraq, but this is what we do. This is what it means to be an American. We shed our blood for less fortunate people. This is who we are; as any Veteran.

I know the hollow feeling that being a Vietnam Veteran brings. I can only guess of the grief that must still linger for Gold Star Families of the Vietnam War.

If you are of the "let's cut our losses and quite now" crowd, just take the time to talk to someone who has lost a loved one who was doing what they knew was right. The knowing that our mission in Iraq is justified is infectious, from the trooper to his or her family. This dedication of the mission stays on in most families even after their loved one has fallen for the cause.

It will not do you any good to call any media outlet for an opinion because they do not want the spirit de corps to get out into the public. They do not report all of the facts. The "facts" many times only reflect the opinion of that media outlet. Talk to someone who has experienced the real deal. Go to someone who has been there. A vast majority will tell you we need to stay and finish the job. They will not want to leave a legacy that steps back to Vietnam. Do not let today's "cut and run" crowd condemn a whole generation of brave men and women to the hollow feeling we Vietnam Vets must endure. Do not let the Gold Star Families of Iraq and Afghanistan be handed the same feeling of loss as those of the Vietnam era.

Do not let them down!

Boy Scouts Recognized for Achievements

The American Legion headquarter's web site states that The American Legion began support of the Boy Scouts of America at its first National Convention in 1919 and that there are more than 2,500 Scouting

The American Legion Sipe-Peterson Post 44 in Scottsdale sponsored a new Boy Scout Troop which was Chartered on March 1, 2009 as American Legion Troop 440, nicknamed "The Troop that Rocks" referring to their indoor rock climbing activities in Scottsdale. Troop 440 is in the Four Peaks District of the Boys Scouts of America Grand Canyon Council in Arizona.

On March 1st, 2010, a National Court of Honor was held at Post 44 to honor three of Troop 440's scouts with Medal of Merit, one of the rare and prestigious decorations awarded for an act of meritorious service.

On June 22, 2009, these three young men assisted in the immediate assistance and care of a seriously injured victim of a rollover vehicle accident on the San Bernardino I-10 freeway outside Indio, California. In addition to rendering first aid to the victim, they assisted in traffic control to protect the scene. Emergency response was 10-15 minutes away. The award was a result of letters of commendation written by a responding California Highway Patrol Officer, a responding paramedic and a firsthand

witness to the accident and the actions of the scouts. As one of the witnesses stated in their letter, "They performed with an uncommon degree of bravery and preparedness. Their first aid skills were remarkable."

The ceremony was attended by the entire scout troop and their families, dignitaries of the Boys Scouts of America Grand Canyon Council, Four Peaks District, Mr. Corey Harris, the Veterans Outreach Coordinator from Arizona Congressman Harry E. Mitchell's office and members of The American Legion. Post 44 Commander Andy Jaime and the Post 44 Club Manager Mike Smith were recognized for their post's support of the troop. Grimaldi's Pizzeria of Old Town Scottsdale donated food for the attendees.

It was also noted that this new Boy Scout Troop which is only a year old was also recently awarded another prestigious District award of being the "Troop of the Year" for 2009".

This is a fine example dedication and training that the Boy Scouts of America can provide to benefit our country and how the efforts of the American Legion in supporting scouting units can make this happen. Now, more than at any time since the end of WWII, veterans are going back to college in record numbers. Grandpa Will Be Missed

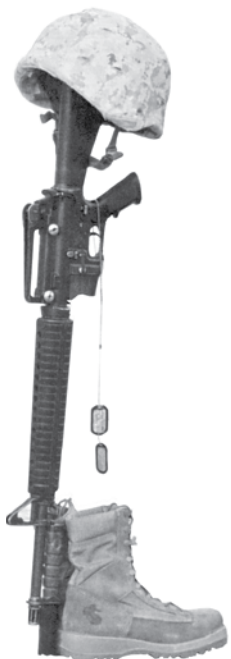
