we have to offer you and here is what we are trying to do for you.

What have we done? The American Legion wrote the original G.I. Bill of Rights and just recently was the leading voice of the Veterans Organizations to amend the Post 9-11 G.I. Bill allowing the younger veterans to attend vocational schools instead of having to take two years of college; a big benefit for learning a trade.

What do we offer? Under our children and youth programs, we offer the Legacy Scholarship and Temporary Financial Assistance. Under Americanism, we offer Boys State, American Legion Law Enforcement Career Academy (ALLECA), Legion Baseball and Oratorical Competitions just to name a few. Last but not least, our dedicated Service Officers who assist and represent our veterans with benefit claims.

What are we trying to do? Last March while back in Washington D.C., we visited our Congressmen and Senators, we discussed and asked their support on some of the following; 1) Protecting VA and DOD from the 2011 Deficit Reduction Law, 2) Disabled Veterans Tax – remove the tax on disabled veterans receiving less than 50% disability, 3) Flag Amendment – protect Old Glory from acts of physical desecration, 4) Maintaining a large and strong National Defense. There are more but too many to list.

I will be asking our National Executive Committeeman, NEC Alternate, our members who have commissions and our members who go on call-ins on committees, to provide a report of what was accomplished and submit it to the Legionnaire for publication. You should know what we are doing.
