Detachment Education & Awards...

In order to submit for a squadron or individual award from the Detachment, a letter of recommendation will be needed on Squadron letterhead the Friday one week prior to Camp Out.

Your submittal letter should contain all pertinent information about the award being applied for, signed by the Squadron Advisor, Squadron Commander and/or Squadron Adjutant. Submitting may be made to Awards Committee Chairman, Bob Hath or turned into the Detachment Adjutant, Chuck Treat.

The Detachment has five major awards each year. They are as follows:

Squadron Awards

The Ken Wyman Memorial Award

Is awarded to the Squadron who shows the most progress on the Ten Ideal and Five Star Programs. Squadrons are encouraged that had members achieve certificates in the Ten Ideal or Five Star programs to put in for this award. In past years, this award was given with as little as two Ten Ideal achieved. The awards are given on a per-capita basis to level the playing field for smaller Squadrons.

The Richard Kepler Memorial Award

For the Squadron with the most per-capita charitable contributions in the fiscal year. Add up all your Squadrons charitable contributions and divide that number by your membership total from the previous year.

Individual Awards

Detachment Son of the Year

Awarded to the Member who best exemplifies what a Son of the American Legion should be. An outline should include all information about the member's involvement in volunteerism, fund raising, participation in patriotic observances, and any other participation pertinent to the award.

The C. G. Lorton Memorial Award

This award is given to the member who contributes the best idea for the betterment of the Post home, Squadron, or the Community. Any idea big or small should be submitted for this award. An idea that has a small effect locally, may blossom into a Statewide or even a National movement.

The James Ashley Memorial Award

This award is given to one Detachment Member with outstanding achievements in fundraising resulting in the highest donations amount for the year.

About the Ten Ideals and Five Star Achievement programs

If you start at the beginning of the fiscal year, you should be able to complete these programs in one year's time. While these Awards should not be given lightly or earned easily, they are a valuable tool in the education and training of young citizens. Note on the Five Star program, the test in the handbook is the final step in earning this award, and should only be given to those members who have earned the right to take the test through their work in all aspects of Squadron participation. As we pass the halfway point in the fiscal year, it will soon be time to honor those members who have done the work for your Squadrons. I would hope that you all have taken our suggestion, and have kept a good record of your member's contributions to the successes of your Squadron. As we have asked in the past, we recommend that you honor your workers on or around the American Legion Birthday in March. As we have said in the past, hard work deserves recognition.

We would also like to remind you the deadline for Detachment Awards is Friday *the week before* the Saturday meeting at Detachment Camp Out.

We look forward to receiving many submissions this year. Please do not assume that if you are a small Squadron that you don't have a chance at one or more of these awards. The Awards that the Detachment gives are on a per-capita basis to even the playing field.

Do you know who should win one of these awards?

- Kepler Award Squadron with the highest per-capita in charitable contributions.
- ✓ Wyman Award Squadron with the most progress on Five Star and Ten Ideals programs.
- Son of the Year Detachment Member who best exemplifies what a Son of the American Legion should be.
- Lorton Award Detachment Member with the best idea for the betterment of the Squadron, Post, or Community.
- Ashley Award Detachment Member with outstanding achievements in fundraising resulting in the highest donations.

Education as a Membership Tool?

When we think about membership tools, what are we usually thinking? Probably ways we can contact our existing members to ask them to renew or ways to attract new ones. We need renewals, and of course we can always use new members. But how do we go about doing that? Most of us would likely say sending emails or letters. Phone calls too if you have their information. Maybe a membership drive to attract new members. But education? How does that work?

It works in many ways, on many levels. You're reading this because The Sons of The American Legion is an organization you believe in and want to participate in. And that is because you have seen the work we do, the causes we support, and the difference we make. But you could know more. We all could. And that knowledge can be used as a membership tool, maybe without you even realizing it.

Why are you a member of The Sons of The American Legion? I am because my father signed me up when I was about 8 years old. But he didn't sign me up and leave me at home. He saw to it I participated in things, attended meetings, honored veterans on Memorial Day, and generally got involved. When I got my first squadron handbook, I saw these things I was eligible to achieve, the Ten Ideals and Five Star Awards.

Participating, studying for those awards, and achieving the awards made me appreciate the organization. If we are signing up our youth, we need to make sure they don't just carry a card.

They need to be educated in the patriotism we believe in, the Americanism we cherish. If we have young members that are not being shown these things, we will likely not retain them as they get older. Retention is key and education works.

And as our younger members grow up, and for those who were not fortunate enough to be raised in the organization but are adult members, The American Legion offers ways you can get that additional education. Having been a member of The Sons of The American Legion for 45 years, I thought I had a good idea what this organization is about. I heard about the newly revised online education tool called *"Basic Training"*. It's free for any member of The American Legion family as long as you have a valid

member ID number by visiting www. legion.org/training. It made me realize how little I knew about the history and intricacies of our organization. But as a result, I can now recruit members with a wealth of knowledge that I had been missing all this time. And as you sign up new members, urge them to take the course as well.

Much like what happened to me as a child, when they learn about the organization and the work we do, they will WANT to renew, not drag their heels until the last possible moment. Recruiting and retention are vital and education works. And for those who want to take that extra step, The American Legion College is available to you as well.

Established at the National level and offered annually at National Headquarters, this week long training is designed for those who want to advance within the organization at the District, Department, or National levels. In addition, many Departments have adapted this training

to suit the needs and schedules of their respective states. This is also a live, in-person course stressing the core values and contributions of The American Legion. These are generally available to members of The Sons of The American Legion, on a space available basis. The curriculum typically centers on the core values of the organization and also considers topics such as media relations, membership recruiting and retention, community relations, and tips for serving today's veterans. Members completing this course will be well suited to take on leadership positions, and have the knowledge to promote the organization and inspire those around them to follow suit and seek further education themselves. Leadership is critical and education works.

As you can see, education works as a membership tool. When the young are educated, they become inspired. They are retained. When

the adult is educated, they share that knowledge with others which leads to increased membership. They are recruiting and retaining new members. And when our leadership is educated, they inspire others to follow in their footsteps.

The educational tools are out there.

Remember to use them as membership tools as well.
