





Riders Are the Face of The American Legion

AZALR's Traveling Trophy is really picking up speed. As of this writing, ALR Chapters 87, 81, 39, 24, 109, 36 and 29 have "stolen" the

trophy. And remember - ALR 5 (Phoenix) will donate \$100 to the charity designated by the ALR Chapter which has won the traveling trophy the most number of times between now and the 2015 Annual AZALR meeting.

At the National Riders' Meeting (which took place at the start of the National Convention in Charlotte, NC, at the end of the Legacy Run), it was announced

that there were 540 motorcycles on the Legacy Run, with a total of 770 registered (riders & passengers). Our National Commander was on the Legacy Run (as a passenger), and told the Riders that the ALR has become the "Face of the American Legion". During the Legacy Run, \$435,000 was raised for the Legacy Foundation by the Riders; another \$400,000+ was donated by Riders on the first day of the Convention, and by the end of the Convention over \$1 million was raised for the Legacy Fund. During the convention, checks were presented on behalf of Arizona ALR 81, 12, 35, 6, 52, 109, 105, 24, 5, 29, 58, 4 and 86 totaling \$18,221.88!

ALR Riders in District 2 continue to be the main supporters (along with TEP) of raising funds

for the Kruzin 4 Kidz Holiday Parade that will take place this year on December 13, 2014. Over the past three years, District 2 Riders have

assisted in raising approximately \$50,000 that went directly to Aviva Children's Services and garnered several hundred toys for the children in their care. Aviva is a Tucson-based non-profit agency that provides a variety of support services and resources to children who have experienced abuse, neglect, or abandonment.
