Local Veteran Receives Life Changing Gift

Mr. Wilbur Quick, a local Korean Veteran, recently received a generous gift from the Cottonwood Home Depot Store – the gift was a new handicap ramp for safer and easier access



to his home!

For the past several years, Mr. Quick's home has had a ramp that had been constructed by volunteers from the Cottonwood Fire Department, after the original ramp had collapsed, injuring him. In the past year, Mr. Quick's health has declined to such a degree that he was relegated to using a motorized wheelchair, resulting in the existing ramp no longer safe for him to enter or exit his residence. In fact, on a few occasions, he took a tumble leaving his residence.

With such a vital need for assistance to a senior Veteran, American Legion Post 135, Sgt-at-Arms, John Maddox, contacted the Manager at the Home Depot in Cottonwood to see if they could provide assistance in

Arizona American Legion Riders Busy Summer For ALR

This summer was a busy time for the Arizona ALR Family.

In June, ALR 91(Chandler) donated \$1,200 to the Missing in America Project; \$500 to a disabled Veteran with cancer; \$500 to

Hope Covenant Church for shoes for underprivileged children; and \$100 to buy school supplies. In July, they donated \$900 to the Honor Flight to send our third WWII Veteran to Washington DC this year. In August, they donated \$250 to Canine Companions for Independence (they train service dogs and give them for free to Veterans with PTSD) and made a \$2,000 donation to their Post. ALR 91 also held a poker run to benefit the PGR which raised a total of \$1,173 (\$150 of that was returned by the winner of the high hand, and \$60 of that was a partial return from the winner of the 50/50 drawing.)

In August, ALR 58 (Fountain Hills) established an Honor Tree, the first of its kind in Arizona. The Honor Tree (originally conceived by 58 Rider Lee Norman, and skillfully constructed by Dutch Gottschalk, 58's Road Captain) was designed to recognize Veterans both past and present for their service. Veterans are honored with a dog tag engraved with their name, branch of service, and specific military conflict that is displayed on the tree. Submission details can be obtained by contacting ALR 58 President John Weedo at 480-390-7714.

In August, ALR District 12 launched a new Facebook page -American Legion Riders District 12 Arizona. The page was created to provide a social media mechanism for showcasing activities and events occurring within District 12 for the purpose of promoting effective communication, cooperation, and support among the District 12 Chapters as well as highlighting their activities and accomplishments. The Facebook page contains several unique features including a summary listing of all American Legion Rider events within all 10 Arizona Districts as well as an interactive map showing the location and contact information for every District 12 Chapter.

ALR 131 (Green Valley) continues to serve a free full breakfast to the residents of the Blind Rehab Clinic at the VA Hospital in Tucson once a month. Their

riders are trained in the handling of the blind, and the blind patients don't ever go away hungry.

And welcome to our newest ALR Chapter - Post 13 in Williams.

At the Legion's National Convention in Baltimore, not only did the Legion Riders lead the National Parade, but it was announced that \$1,249,684.13 had been raised (primarily by the Riders) for The American Legion Legacy Scholarship Fund. National Commander, Mike Helm, asked for a standing ovation for the ALR for setting another record. Arizona ALR was well represented on stage by John Moffitt (ALR 6), Judi Beischel (ALR 58), Steve Aguirre (ALR 59) and Holly Jensen (ALR 52) (Jim Beischel, ALR 58, was there as always – in the audience taking pictures). The Arizona ALR contributions made to the Legacy Fund at the National Convention totaled \$21,478.05. Many thanks to the Arizona Chapters (and their members) who contributed: ALR 4 (\$3,000), ALR 5 (\$750 + \$100 on behalf of ALR 39 for winning the traveling trophy last year the most number of times), ALR 6 (\$500), ALR 8 (\$500), ALR 12 (\$250), ALR 14 (\$220), ALR 29 (\$1,778.05 + \$1,430 in honor of Fred Manske), ALR 34(\$900 + \$100), ALR 36 (\$500), ALR 52 (\$750), ALR 58 (\$500 from their ALR, \$500 from the Post, \$500 from their S.A.L., and \$500 from their Auxiliary), ALR 59 (\$100 personally donated by Steve Aguirre), ALR 61 (\$2,000), ALR 69 (\$100), ALR 93 (\$500),



ALR 97 (\$100), ALR 105 (\$1,050 + \$400 personally donated by Linda Morris), ALR 109 (\$500), ALR 131 (\$100), ALR 138 (\$500) and District 8, Department of Arizona (\$100). Additionally, ALR 86 presented \$3,250 to the National Commander during the Legacy Run itself (\$1,500 from the Post, \$1,500 from ALR 86 and \$250 from SAL Squadron 86).

upgrading the ramp to make it safer for Wilbur. Working directly with the Cottonwood Store Manager Steve Machek, Mr. Maddox was informed of a program recently instituted by the Home Depot Foundation, with \$1 million set aside for projects just like this. Within a few weeks, the paperwork was completed and the project was approved.

The Home Depot Foundation volunteer construction team provided all the manpower and womanpower to get the job done. Within less than four hours, they dismantled the existing ramp (hauled it away), and installed a new 12-foot ramp that extended from the porch to within a foot of the street, making it safer to mount the ramp, at a safer angle and at a safe distance from the passing vehicles on the road.

According to Legion Project Officer, Mr. Maddox, "the all wood ramp, with hand railings, is state of the art, was constructed at the store and transported to Mr. Quick's home for ease of installation." He went on to say that the walkway is approximately four feet wide to accommodate Mr. Quick's newer wider mobile chair and is illuminated with six solar light caps on the hand railing supports to provide lighting during dark hours.

When asked about the new ramp, Mr. Quick says, "I can't believe how great my new "runway" looks and I'm truly grateful to Home Depot for not only helping me, but for all the Veterans who will also benefit from this program." With this new handicap ramp, Mr. Quick can now come and go without fear of leaving and returning home.

Home Depot Team members consisted of Team Captain, Lou Thompson; Mark Griffes; Sally Reynolds; Rosita Garcia; and Jerry Garrett. A HUGE THANK YOU TO HOME DEPOT!

Chaplain's Corner Dealing With Loss

Upon hearing the word loss, people automatically associate it with death as opposed to something as trivial as losing a cell

phone. Oddly enough, some folks consider the loss of the phone catastrophic. These folks might consider a reorganization of their priorities. Loss comes in many forms and often is not even recognized by those closest to the one who suffers the loss. A huge drop in the stock market could easily leave someone financially devastated. Loss of a job would have an equal effect. Having to care for a loved one or family member whose mind is gradually diminishing and no longer resembles the person you knew can be heart-breaking. A negative diagnosis from the doctor can bring mental chaos to someones mind as they experience their daily life becomes more and more restrictive as they are able to do less and less for themselves. Being able to care for ourselves is a cherished gift we don't recognize until that ability starts to disappear.

Had you invited God into your heart at the first stage, the severity of the next four stages could have been reduced greatly. Having a close relationship with God provides an inner peace that cannot be compared to anything. It stills your mind and your heart when you realize that whatever it is that's happening is the will of God. God will provide you with the strength you need to deal. All you have to do is sincerely believe in His love for you.

Do this when you are assailed by any problem. Invite God over for happy hour. Have a long visit. It might not cure what ails you but it can make the ailment a lot easier to deal with.

National Commander Applaudes "Get Out the Vote" Program

It's hard to miss the political rhetoric these days. Thanks to 24hour news, social media and the headline-grabbing half-truths, the 2016 presidential campaign is already in full swing.

Many of us would prefer candidates stick to the issues. We would like real answers on real issues. How would candidates address concerns with VA care? How would candidates prioritize national security issues such as ISIS, our southern border and North Korea?

Even if we sometimes feel disenchanted with our political system, it's still the best in the world. We, the people, get to cast our votes and decide who will represent us from town council to city mayor to state governor to federal lawmakers and, of course, the president.

There are many opportunities throughout the year when Legionnaires register voters in their communities. One example: at a naturalization ceremony last month in LaPlace, La., Legion Family members signed up new citizens to vote. But your post doesn't have to hold such a ceremony to sign up new voters.

The Legion's "Get Out the Vote" program encourages American Legion posts, districts and departments to be actively engaged in the electoral process by serving as poll volunteers, poll workers and by encouraging and assisting others to register and vote.

In just a few short months, the first ballots for the 2016 presidential nominations will be counted at primaries and caucuses. I would encourage posts and districts to consider how best they can promote the Legion's Get Out the Vote program (download the PDF: http://www.legion.org/sites/legion.org/files/legion/publications/Get-Out-The-Vote-Brochure.pdf) and assist nonregistered voters in your community to participate in our election process.

We have all fought for the right for free elections. Let's take that another step by educating our fellow citizens on the process.

HOHP 39 Foot Mobile Health Center

HOHP (Honoring, Helping, Hiring Our Heroes of Pinal County). About a year ago, HOHP had the opportunity to secure a 39 foot Mobile Health Center from the County of Pinal. The Pinal County Health Department Director, a Veteran himself, put in a request to transfer the vehicle to HOHP so that it could be converted into a much needed Mobile Veteran Outreach Center. The request was taken before the Board of Supervisors for consideration. Initially, Pinal County received a grant from the Gila River Indian Community for the mobile outreach clinic for the county and it was no longer in use.

On December 17, 2014, the Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to sell the Mobile Unit to HOHP for \$1.00. HOHP worked with local organizations to secure the funding needed through donations to wrap the vehicle in its current beautiful uniform. You can tell by all the Eagles displayed on the unit that it was honorably named "Eagle One"!

Eagle One is a bold statement of what can be accomplished through the cooperation and coordinated efforts of people from all walks of life (Veterans and their families, concerned Veterans Organizations, 501c(3) organizations etc.).A Grant to operate the mobile unit in Pinal County for the next three years was approved by the Gila River Indian Community and the Pinal County Board of Supervisors.

We hope to have the Mobile Unit serving veterans in the rural areas of our county in mid-October 2015.
