Facility Accomplishment

NAVAHCS Homeless Programs (& Community Partners) in 2022



- Provided 445 Permanent Housing Placements (PHPs) to homeless Veterans
- 157.24% of facility's target goal
- Health Care for Homeless Veterans (HCHV) program currently houses 372 Veterans through VA Supportive Housing (VASH) program
- The U.S. Vets Grant Per Diem program (GPD) currently transitionally houses 50 homeless Veterans. Jerry Ambrose Veterans Council of Mohave County GPD in Kingman transitionally houses 16 homeless Veterans
- The U.S. Vets Frail Elderly program transitionally houses 8 Veterans
- Transition in Place (TIP) program currently houses 10 Veterans through U.S. Vets, 6 are through Catholic Charities TIP

The new PACT Act

» Expands toxic-exposed Veterans access to VA care

» Extends health care eligibility for Vietnam, Gulf War, and Post-9/11 era combat Veterans

» Adds new presumptive conditions for radiation, Agent Orange, Gulf War toxins, and burn pit exposures

COMPACT Act

Veterans Comprehensive Prevention, Access to Care, and Treatment Act of 2020 (COMPACT)

- As of Jan. 17, Veterans in suicidal crisis can got to any health care facility at VA or in the community, for free emergency care
- Could increase access to acute suicide care to an additional 9 million unenrolled Veterans and reduce the number of suicides by offering immediate care when they are most vulnerable
