PACT Act Update

*Processing of benefits claims for all Veterans and survivors began Jan. 1, 2023



» Expands toxic-exposed Veterans access to VA care

» Extends health care eligibility for Vietnam, Gulf War, and Post-9/11 era combat Veterans

» Adds new presumptive conditions for radiation, Agent Orange, Gulf War toxins, and burn pit exposures

Toxic Exposure Screening (TES) Dashboard as of Feb 28, 2023

8,896 Unique Veterans screened
46% indicated at least 1 exposure concern
42% indicated no exposure concerns
12% don't know or declined



COMPACT Act

Veterans Comprehensive Prevention, Access to Care, and Treatment Act of 2020 (COMPACT)

- As of Jan. 17, Veterans in suicidal crisis can go to any health care facility in the VA or in the community, for free emergency care
- Is expected to increase access to acute suicide care to an additional 9 million unenrolled Veterans and reduce the number of suicides by offering immediate care for the most vulnerable Veterans
