### Leadership Changes

• Mr. Sample has been appointed as the Medical Center Director, effective August 14, 2022. Nathan Hizer is the Interim Associate Director. We are going through the Boarding process for our newly selected Nurse Executive/Associate Director of Patient Care Services. Once the process is complete and will announce the name and anticipated start date.

### Mask Mandate

• It is important for our Veterans to understand that VA requires a medical grade mask in all clinical care areas on the main campus and CBOCs. If someone does not have a mask, our staff will provide one. It is vital, especially with this current variant, that we continue to protect our Veterans and staff.

# COVID-19 (As of August 30th, 2022)

- COVID-19 cases in the area have shown a decrease within the last month.
- Currently we have 1 COVID positive inpatient, 17 outpatients and 5 staff unable to work.
- The COVID-19 vaccine is still available to all Veterans, spouses, and/or caregivers. Please call **928-717-7406** to schedule an appointment to receive the vaccine or booster shot.
- As of August 2022, NAVAHCS administered a total of 29,333 COVID-19 vaccines.

# <u>Monkey Pox</u>

• NAVAHCS has 30 doses of the vaccine available for at-risk patients. We have a plan in place to notify at-risk Veterans of vaccine availability to schedule their shot.

# Flu Vaccine

NAVAHCS is anticipating receiving the Flu vaccine within the next few weeks. We will have the
vaccine available at the main hospital in Prescott (including a drive-thru clinic) as well as at the
CBOCs Monday – Friday during normal business hours. Information about the Flu vaccine will
be provided to Veterans through our <u>Internet site</u>, <u>Facebook page</u> and Gov Delivery email.

# VA Video Connect (VVC) Data (as of August 30th):

This FY (October 2021 – present) we have provided 21,837 VVC appointments for Veterans and we will continue to utilize VVC services in-lieu of face-to-face appointments.

### Housing Updates for Veterans:

- The HCHV program continues to be on track to meet their portion of the national goal to house 38,000 homeless Veterans this year.
- The program currently houses 362 Veterans through the VA Supportive Housing (VASH) program.
- The US Vets Grant Per Diem program (GPD) transitionally houses 58 homeless Veterans.
- Jerry Ambrose Veterans Council of Mohave County GPD in Kingman transitionally houses 24 homeless Veterans.
- The U.S. Vets Frail Elderly program transitionally houses 9 Veterans.
- The Transition in Place (TIP) program currently houses 13 Veterans through U.S. Vets and 7 are enrolled with Catholic Charities TIP.

#### Vocational Rehabilitation:

- CWT VHA Vocational Rehabilitation participated in its 2<sup>nd</sup> Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) accreditation survey with a successful outcome of "No Recommendations".
  - When a program is CARF accredited, it means that it has undergone an in-depth review of its services and demonstrated substantial conformance to the CARF standards.
  - CWT Supported Employment services is officially available to Veterans in the Kingman area.

• VHA Outpatient Services Survey of the past 90 days shows an 89.7% Trust Score rating which indicates Veterans trust NAVAHCS with their care. VISN 22 Trust Score was 88.6% for the same period.
