# **COVID Update**

- Facility is now focused on the VHA COVID-19 Operational Plan. Emergency Incident Command has been sunset at this time and can be resumed at any time if needed. Hospitalizations continue to be monitored and the facility has a dozen COVID patients in house.
- Vaccines and boosters are available at multiple locations for Veterans, spouses, and caregivers. Walk-in hours and appointments are available. (*To schedule, you may call the COVID vaccine line for an appointment:* **602-604-3915**)
- COVID -19 Testing You must have an order from your provider to receive a test.
- COVID Vaccines for Veterans in the Community
  - Veterans may also get vaccines in the community, as they are covered through community care. The VA can provide vaccines for Veterans who received their first dose in the community. Veterans will need to show their vaccine card as proof of their first/initial dose.

## Veteran Experience:

Masking Update:

• We continue to require FDA-approved Medical Procedure masks for all who enter our facilities. VA will issue a disposable mask when you arrive on campus if you do not have one. This applies to all patients, visitors, employees, contractors, and volunteers and applies to all buildings in which PVAHCS employees are working.

Visitor Policy:

- All visitors will be screened according to CDC guidelines and wear a mask at all times.
- Our visitor policy has returned to pre-COVID hours.
- No visitors under age 15 on inpatient units.
- Visitors are now allowed in our Community Living Center in a limited capacity based on community positivity and transmission rates.

## Phoenix 32<sup>nd</sup> Street VA Clinic is NOW OPEN

Our brand-new, state-of-the-art clinic, the Phoenix 32<sup>nd</sup> Street VA Health Care Clinic, officially opened to patient care on June 27. We hosted Deputy Secretary of Veterans Affairs, the Honorable Donald Remy, along with the Assistant Under Secretary for Health for Operations, RimaAnn Nelson, for a ribbon-cutting celebration on June 22. This Clinic consolidates primary care and mental health services, along with some ancillary services, a Veterans Resource Center, classroom space, a Canteen and Retail store, and more, all in one 200,000-square-foot building. Primary care patients from our Midtown and Thunderbird locations, as well as Emerald and Gold Clinics from the main facility, along with Mental Health from the main facility, will now receive their care at the 32<sup>nd</sup> Street location. Appointments will automatically transfer to the new location! There is ample parking and public transportation is also available nearby.
